
Year 5/6 News

We are beginning to construct a comparison between the Storm Boy movie and book and state our preference for how the story was depicted. Students have been recognising figurative language in the books to promote a visual image of the story. Paining a picture with words encourages the students to build on their vocabulary to use in their writing, including the use of similes, metaphors etc to take their writing to the next level.

We now have a comfortable 'reading nook' with some couches, cushions and even a coffee table. The table has a 1 000-piece puzzle on it and is currently being put together by the students during their 'down time'. It is amazing how much reading takes place when the students have somewhere comfortable to sit and enjoy the simple act of reading a book.

Students have begun to consolidate their skills at being reflective learners through the following 5 questions. By promoting a sense of agency through being reflective learners we empower students to take ownership over their learning. If you could please encourage your child to learn these 5 questions and model some meaningful responses that would be very helpful. We will be consolidating these questions over the coming weeks.






Unlocking the Secrets of Reading: "A Guide for Parents"

 - Vocabulary: Building knowledge of word meanings in isolation and in context.
 - Comprehension: The capacity to extract and construct meaning from written text.

Recent studies have added "Oral Language" as a foundation, creating the "Big 6." These components are the building blocks of proficient reading.

The Journey Continues: Reading in Secondary School

As your child progresses through school, reading evolves. While early primary students may need more support in phonemic awareness and basic phonics, secondary students face challenges related to fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. These skills are vital for reading to learn, a crucial aspect of secondary school success.

Current Issues and the Path Forward

We acknowledge that there are various reading approaches and methods. Some, like the "multi-cueing" approach, may lack strong scientific support. It's crucial for parents to be aware of evidence-based reading practices and to advocate for their children's reading success.

Conclusion:

Learning to read proficiently is a critical aspect of your child's education and future. The science of reading provides us with a roadmap to ensure that every child becomes a capable reader. By understanding the building blocks of reading and advocating for evidence-based approaches in your child's education, you can empower them to unlock the door to a world of knowledge, imagination, and opportunity through reading.
